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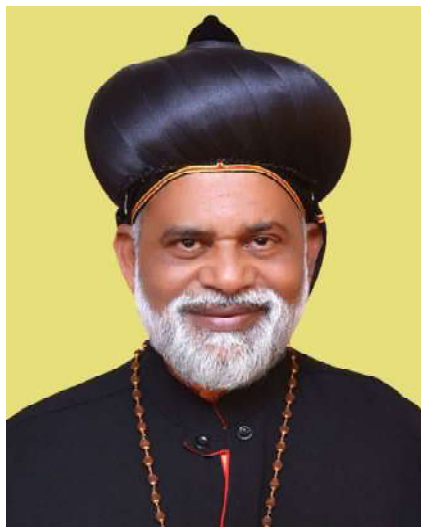
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Voice of Patron

Dear Rev. Fathers, Sisters and beloved Lay Faithful,

I am happy to pen down a couple of lines for our November edition of Shanthivani. As we are in the month of November, it reminds us of the sanctification and the renewal of the Church, followed by the message of the Angel to Zachariah with regard to the birth of John the Baptist, Virgin Mary to be the Mother of God and her subsequent visit to Elizabeth. As you all know, we are in a difficult and



different situation. The month of October made many of us to think and to remain proactive in responding to the challenges of the present day Church life. We are aware of the various measures that are taken to counteract the government insistence to pass the anti-conversion Bill and the directive to take survey of the churches, pastors and the place of worship. Given this backdrop, each of these events, has a new message for us and to the world today. The answer given by St. Peter to the question, that you are the son of the living God, categorically makes it clear the relation between Christ and Christianity. This answer not only prevents the Christian faith from being seen as merely another philosophical system or a path of spirituality but also firmly affirms Jesus as the One and only Son of the living God. This state of mind cannot be achieved by human reason, but only by Divine revelation. The Church as a whole is called to a Divine discernment at every stage of her existence. As we are in the world but not of the world, we are called to be cleansed by way of keeping ourselves free from the snares of the devils and merely earthly pursuits. Each one is considered a temple of God (1 Cor 3/16). It means our hearts

and minds must be cleansed of earthly matters which instead enables us not to confine ourselves to selfishness but to behave as children God. This is the way how the Divine discernment must take place in each of us in our day today life and activities.

As we move to the announcement of the birth of John the Baptist, through his doubting of the message of the Angel we are constantly reminded of our human weakness and lack of faith to the Divine revelations. Even though Zachariah is punished for his lack of faith, even when he remained righteous before God, it serves as a proof to Gabriel's announcement. As he wrote, saying, "his name is John", his mouth was opened and his tongue got loosed. In the case of Blessed Virgin Mary, we see altogether a different way of discernment. How can this be? Mary's question does not indicate a lack of faith as Zachariah did. Rather she is merely inquiring into the manner in which something so extraordinary would happen. Mary's faithful response is that of a highest form of obedience to God and submission to God's will. As we are approaching the Advent Season, we are once again called upon to submit ourselves to the will of God in our day today life after the example of our Blessed Mother Mary. Let as St. Paul exhorts us, this discerning and submission be fruitful in our day today life. "As there was a readiness to desire it, so also may be a completion out of what you have (2 Cor 8/11)". It means, what we have desired or accepted should not remain merely in the wish and thought rather must be made tangible through deeds and practice in life. Let us keep all people without caste or creed who suffer from depression or any sort of burn out that they find support and a light that opens them up to life after the monthly prayer intention of the Holy Father. God bless all!

Walking together : Communion in Praxis

Introduction

Pope Francis' recent invitation to the church to rediscover its synodal nature with the theme "For a synodal church: communion, participation and mission" calls for the church to renew by the action of the Holy Spirit, listening together to what God says to his people. It is an invitation to renew and rededicate itself as a community bearing the beacon of light to the society as a whole and to continue

an "aggiornamento", a renewal of the Church proposed by the Second Vatican Council. This journeying together demands listening, dialogue and community discernment. This "journeying together" expresses the very nature of the church as pilgrim people of God. It reminds us about our responsibility to pursue our mission, that is, to be his prophetic witnesses. As the preparatory document attests, this "walking together is the most effective way of manifesting and putting into practice the nature of the church as the pilgrim and missionary people of God". It is a "journeying together" towards the encounter with Christ the Lord. On this journey, the church, the whole people of God, both the *Ecclesia docens* and *Ecclesia discens*, without separation, as one *sensus fidei*, is called for to witness Christ and "to be a spiritual house and a holy priesthood" to the wider society. Here we shall reflect on various dimensions proposed by the pope for walking together for a synodal church and renewal of the people of God.

Dialogue

Dialogue is to be seen as a key to realise the renewal of the church. In the early church there was dialogue. On matters of serious concern, there was discussion and deliberate decision making by concerned persons and it was approved by all (Acts 15). If the church is people of God, there should be intense internal sharing: a living dialogue between the pastors and between pastors and the faithful. Mutual respect and love is essential for any dialogue. We need to listen patiently and attentively to everything the other person wants to say: “We ought to be able to acknowledge the other person’s truth, the value of his or her deepest concerns, and the content they are trying to communicate” (AL 138). The sanctifying power of the spirit is at work in all the baptized. The Second Vatican Council reminds us that “the whole body of the faithful, who have an anointing which comes from the Holy One, cannot err in matters of belief” and Pope Francis reminds us that this “anointing makes it infallible in *credendo*” (EG 119). Therefore all the baptized should get a chance to share his experience and concerns of the church and those who are in authority ought to listen them in silence.

Dialogue means mutual communion in which the partners are taken seriously. It does not exclude the official authority of the pastors and obedience due to them. But pastors exercise their authority in a dialogic fashion, thinking that authority is for service. The members of the people of God are united by Baptism and “if by the will of Christ some are made teachers, pastors and dispensers of mysteries on behalf of others, yet all share a true equality with regard to the dignity and to the activity common to all the faithful for the building up of the body of Christ (1Cor 12:27-28; LG 32). All those who compose the one people of God, both pastors and the general faithful, can engage in dialogue with ever-binding fruitfulness. For the bonds which unite the faithful are mightier than anything that divides them” (GS 92). The present synod on synodality aims not at mere discussion on matters of concern in hierarchical levels but a dialogue from local to the universal levels including all the faithful, listening what Spirit speaks through all the baptized.

Participation

The renewal of the church demands the journey of the whole church which God expects of the church of third millennium. This journeying together means incorporation of the laity in church administration and mutual listening of the people of God. The faithful people, the college of Bishops, the bishop of Rome: all listening to each other and all listening to the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth (Jn 14:17) because Holy Spirit breathes over the whole people of God and it is necessary to listen to the people who discern God's will for his church. We have to recognize, appreciate and benefit the variety of gifts and charisms that Spirit of God bestows to the faithful for the good of the community (1 Cor 12:1-11).

The concept of synodality is to be applied to all aspects of the life of the church: participation of the laity, administration and evangelization. "All baptized, whatever their position in the church... are agents of evangelization" (EG 120). Therefore considering the majority of the faithful simply as passive recipients is not proper for a synodal church. More renewal is needed in the conception of the church as people of God underlined by Vatican II. The role of laity especially the women in the administrative roles and decision making powers is to be re-evaluated and necessary steps should be taken. "Without discrimination women should be participants in the life of the church and also in consultation and the process of coming to decisions" (CL, 51). The recent institution of the lay ministry of catechist by Pope Francis is to be seen in this direction. It gives more colours to the realization of our dream of a synodal church where everyone is appreciated and acknowledged. It should be seen as exploring the sharing of exercising responsibility in the proclamation of the Gospel and participation of the laity in the co-responsibility of evangelization.

Each one has the responsibility to contribute to the edification of the people of God. Vatican II reminds us that all the baptized, both the hierarchy and the laity are called to be active participants in the saving mission of the church (LG 32-33). The faithful have

received the anointing in Baptism and Confirmation and are endowed with diverse gifts and charisms for the renewal and building up of the church, as members of the body of Christ. Therefore a kind of consultative process is very important and necessary in the renewed church. Experience and insights of the faithful is to be taken seriously. This is a process of listening to each other, contemplating the word of God and reading the signs of the times. All the members of the faithful must seek guidance in the Holy Scripture and in the tradition of the faith of the people of God. Hierarchical authority must take into account the judgement of the faithful and exercise authority in dialogue. The Jerusalem council (Acts 15) is a good paradigm for dialogue and participation of the faithful in the ecclesial affairs of serious nature.

Communion

Church is the communion of believers. Baptism is the door and the foundation of communion in the church. The body of Christ in the Eucharist sacramentalizes this communion, that is, it is a sign and actually brings about the intimate bonds of communion among all the faithful in the body of Christ which is the church (CL, 19). Because we, who are many, partaking in the same Eucharistic body of Christ, become part of his mystical body the church. If we wish to be faithful to God's plan and respond to world's yearnings, the great challenge that the church faces in the third millennium is to make her the home and school of communion (NMI, 43). It is our duty to keep this body undivided. "The spirituality of communion implies the ability to see what is positive in others, to welcome it and to prize it as a gift from God, and to make room for others, sharing each other's burden. Unless we follow this spiritual path, the external structures of communion serve very little purpose" (NMI, 29).

Mission: Evangelization and Sanctification of the church

The church is holy because all are re clothed in Christ Jesus and refreshed by his spirit. St. Paul admonishes Christians to live "as is proper among saints" (Eph 5:3). The fruit of life according to the spirit is holiness. Let us live by the spirit and be guided by the spirit

(Gal 5:25). This sanctification should be initiated from within. More than an institution, Church is people of God. The sanctification of the church means sanctification of the community of believers. Our vocation is to be the temple of God and to be perfect as our heavenly father is perfect (Mt 5:45). In *Lumen Gentium* Church stresses, “Finally all Christ’s faithful, whatever be the conditions, duties and circumstances of their lives... will daily increase in holiness, if they receive all things with faith from the hand of their heavenly father and if they cooperate with divine will” (LG 41). Our duty as people of God and children of God is to be in communion with God the Trinity and one another and to be witnesses to His love.

Conclusion

The purpose of the recent synod is “to inspire people to dream about the church we are called to be, to make people’s hope flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission” (PD 32). Let us hope that our walking together, listening to the Holy Spirit and to one another will bear more fruit. A church united both in spirit and action, in the communion of hierarchy and Lay faithful, giving due respect to the rights, dignity and opinion of each participant can realise the dream of witnessing God’s love to the end of the earth.

Month of Rosary

Marriage Preparation Course

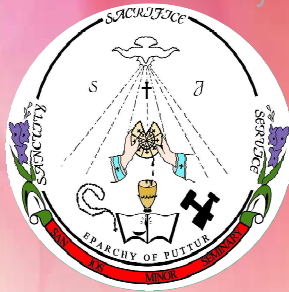
